WALTER J. CISZEK, S.J. (1904-1984), was a Polish-American Jesuit priest known for his missionary work in the Soviet Union during and after World War II. He was eventually arrested by the Soviets as a spy and spent fifteen years in the Gulag. He was released and returned to the United States in 1963, after which he wrote two books, including the memoir With God in Russia, and served as a spiritual director. Since 1990, Ciszek has been under investigation by the Roman Catholic Church for anonization. His current title is Servant of God.

This is one of the best books I have read on man's search for meaning, and finding the Will of God. It doesn't have miraculous healings, or mass conversions. But it does have evidence of the work of the Holy Spirit both within and around a man who kept trying to go further with his vocation to find the will of God. It is beautifully simply written. He was clearly a man of uncomplicated thinking, a stubborn strength of character, and by also by grace, a strong enough physical constitution to survive 5 years solitary confinement and northern Siberian labour camps for 15 years!

This was one of the best books I have ever read. Fr. Ciszek's reflections on discerning the will of God and accepting every moment of every day, good and bad, as God's will has been a tremendous help in my spiritual life. I have already purchased another copy of this as a gift and plan on giving away several more copies. Highly recommend it for anyone seeking to know God's will in their life.

There are many books of Christian spirituality and/or experiences with which the reader simply cannot connect. They are good, the lessons they teach are important, but the average layman has trouble seeing them as being part of his life. This is not so with Fr. Ciszek's book because Fr. Ciszek speaks from his heart and does not hide his own struggles. He freely admits to the same struggles that we all have -- struggles to understand God's ways in our lives, the temptation to just walk away from following the Lord, the discouragements and pain. He also gives us the victory he found in surrendering all to God and letting God control everything. It is easy for us to think that we have surrendered to God and have made Him the Lord and King of our lives when, in fact, we are not at all fully surrendered.Fr. Ciszek's book is is an inspiration because he shows us the ordinary struggles that even a great man -- a man who will be canonized a saint one day -- have with

completely surrendering to God and letting Him take us wherever He knows is best for us.
