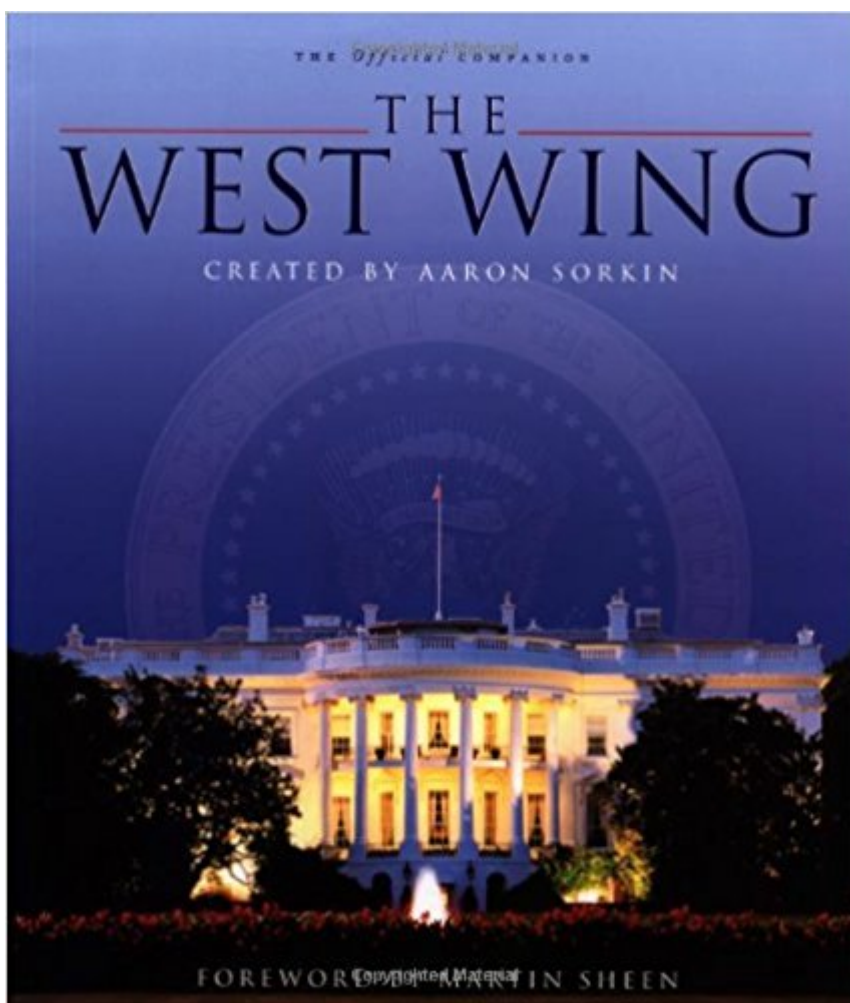

Synopsis

A dark-horse candidate comes from behind to win his party's nomination. A very frustratingly written book. I have many "companion" books to my favorite shows/movies. I have never seen one so lacking as this one. Oddly, nowhere in the book does it list the author(s). It

does not describe any of the photos, e.g., list the people's names who are in the photos. I of course recognized the actors, but had no idea what Aaron Sorkin looked like. I had to Google him to see a picture, then refer back to the book. Also, it describes the episodes in detail. While a small description of an episode is desirable, it's superfluous to have all of it, as we've seen it already! I much prefer having behind-the-scenes stories and anecdotes. All-in-all, a complete let-down.

I got this for my dad who has just discovered Netflix and has been binge watching *The West Wing*-- mostly as a tactic to avoid watching the news! He's a retired missionary and hasn't mentioned any sexual content or violence-- and believe me-- he would if it were in there! He really likes it so I'll be keeping an eye out for similar books.

The West Wing (The Official Companion)? Really? Yeah I guess it is...if there were only 2 seasons of *The West Wing*. I bought this expecting it to cover the entire show not just the first 2 seasons. I would like to return it but I probably won't due to the low cost of the book and the hassle of having to return it.

The book itself is in great condition, but it is not what I expected it to be. It is not a companion (or I should say it is barely a companion). They really only discuss a few incidents in the show and a few shows themselves. It doesn't even give a complete list of characters, situations, explanations of situations, etc. It's full of pictures and some behind the scenes revelations, but that's about it. I would not purchase it.

I love *The West Wing* and enjoy anything behind-the-scenes. Maybe I didn't pay attention, but on a quick page-through, this is only a compendium about the first season and features a detailed synopsis about each episode. The character comments about themselves and their castmates are a nice insight but there is not much else. However, the podcast by Josh Malina is much more informative.

I recently became a *West Wing* fan when I was recovering from surgery, this is the best TV series there ever was! After watching all seasons I found myself looking for more information on the writer, actors and the series itself. There is a wonderful book with a forward written by Martin Sheen who actually was the last actor to join the series. It gives insights from Aaron Sorkin the creator and the actors as well as beautiful color photos of the sets and an episode by episode narrative for the first

two seasons, I have never been interested in a TV series at this level, the only limitation is that it only covers the first two seasons.

I was very excited to see that an official companion had been compiled for *The West Wing*. The first two seasons of the show are covered in this guide, and as the show was in its prime during its first years, it is understandable that there are many talking points. The guide is quite detailed and provides a synopsis of each episode. On the outer edges of the pages are comments and insight by cast, crew, and the production staff. Also included are biographies of each actor and an account of how the show came into being. The guide is wonderful in its detail, though this also has its faults. I personally bought the book for behind the scenes information, and while there is certainly some included, the main focus of the book is on episode descriptions. I feel that each synopsis should have been shorter, and that analysis and anecdotal information should have taken center stage. The accounts provided by cast and crew are fascinating, and still make the book worth its value, but more behind the scenes facts would have made it even better. Overall, though, a great companion, especially for newcomers to the show.

If I could give this a 4.5 rating I would, but only because it doesn't have all the episodes in it. I wish I had read the other reviews before buying this, so I wasn't disappointed when I found out. That being said, this book is great! Well written, with good information about the first two seasons' episodes, it really is the perfect companion to *The West Wing*. I have been watching the entire series again on Netflix, so this came at the perfect time. The book is very large, so it's probably just as well that it's just the first two seasons.
