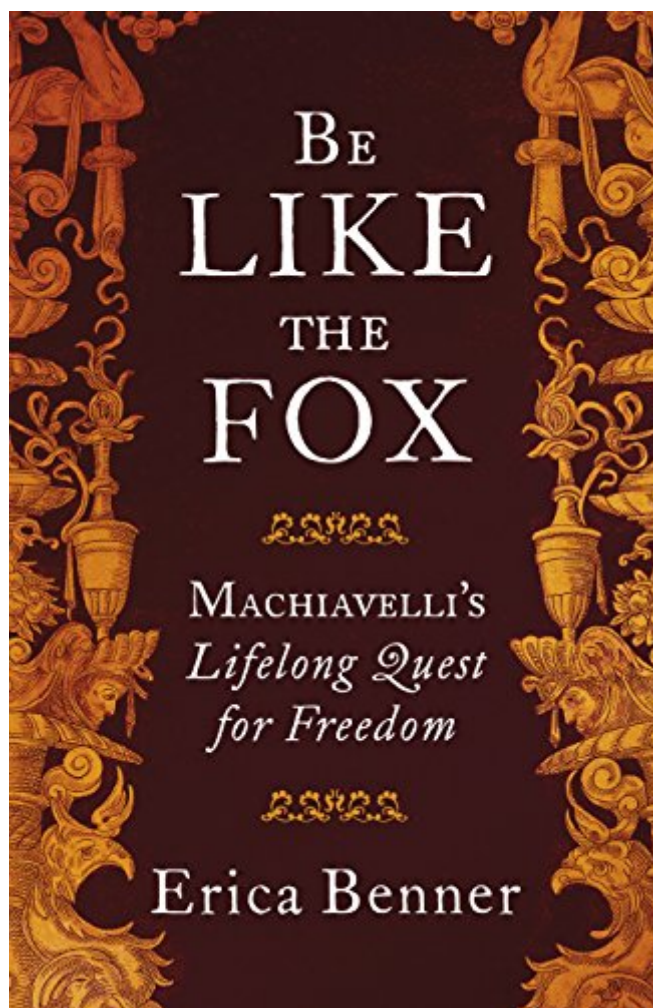

"Machiavellianism" is an undesirable word. It portrays dishonest public officials, of the sort Machiavelli termed most notably in *The Prince*. Machiavelli called dishonest behaviour, such as deceitfulness and the killing of innocents, as being regular and in effect in political affairs. Machiavelli was born in 1469 in Florence, one of the many city-states of Renaissance Italy. Some of these states were republics. *Be Like the Fox*, tells Machiavelli's life story. Its title refers to his instruction that by being like the fox one can avoid snares. The author Benner shapes Machiavelli's own words into a discourse, which gives clarification, as to how her protagonist makes his way through his the encounters with the church, with Cesare Borgia, cruelty and being an outcast. At the book's conclusion, his later years of writing, Benner also makes a somewhat contentious, case for a third way of looking at the reading of Machiavelli, suggesting that his true views were often concealed for reasons of political expediency and that a prince who actually followed *The Prince*'s advice was doomed to failure. Machiavelli's sayings make *Be Like the Fox* an innovative, lively and comprehensible book. It makes for a very appealing narrative, nonetheless this method to storytelling confines the prospect of seeking the advance of Machiavelli's thought.
