

This introduction to the Ancient Near East includes coverage of Egypt and a balance of political, social, and cultural coverage. Organized by the periods, kingdoms, and empires generally used in Near Eastern political history, the text interlaces social and cultural history with the political narrative. This combination allows students to get a rounded introduction to the subject of Ancient Near Eastern history. An emphasis on problems and areas of uncertainty helps students understand how evidence is used to create interpretations and allows them to realize that several different interpretations of the same evidence are possible. Truly excellent introductory textbook to the Ancient Near East and Egypt. It is precisely the right length with an ideal amount of detail: not too much, but Stiebing goes into particularly interesting problems in his "Debating the Evidence" sections. I just used it this quarter and it worked beautifully, accompanied by Pritchard's sourcebook. This book is better than Amelie Kuhrt's double volume masterwork IN THE SENSE THAT it is at a more appropriate level for the students, although as an instructor you will want to read Kuhrt's before or alongside. It is also in some respects nicer than Mario Liverani's THE ANCIENT NEAR EAST: ECONOMY, SOCIETY, AND CULTURE in the sense that it includes all of the Persian Empire; Liverani stops at 500 or so BC. I also like this work better than Mieroop's one-volume ANE: Mieroop's is great (don't get me wrong) but Mieroop does not do much with the Israelites and Hebrews, and Mieroop also does not cover Egypt in that book (although his book on Egypt is great). I'm not trashing these other books, which are completely excellent. Rather, I am stating that Stiebing's book is the all-around best for an intro to ANE course.
