I'm having a lot of fun trying to play these tunes at the proper pace! Most are jig and reel at 127bpm or above, some reaching 200bpm! This isn't a book I'd recommend for the total beginner, more likely intermediate level or above, but everything in it is fun to play and fun to hear. This is the kind of stuff you'll love to play if you have a St. Patrick's Day gig at a local bar, or just with some pals who want to play along with drum and guitar. I did notice a typo or two, but once you spot them, it's the addition of a gracenote or a strike and it's fixed. This book was on my wish-list for a long time and I'm pleased to finally get it. There are many fantastic tunes sadly not in the mainstream of contemporary Highland piping including a few 'rule breaking' tunes with c-naturals. I was surprised to find a number of issues in the book that should have been caught & fixed in editing. These issues are not bad however; competent players/musicians will catch these and *most-of-the-time* be able to correct for them. Still, I'm pleased to further explore the music with an Irish focus and am sure it will prove to be a cherished book in my collection and the music book collections of pipers everywhere.

I am adding Irish tunes to my collection and this looked like a good book for the price!

A very interesting book. I still need to learn to play the whistle, but once I'm finished with that, I plan to move over to the bagpipe practice chanter. This is a very intriguing collection.

Pros: good collection of some faves and standards. Easy-to-read size notes. Cons: Not sorted by easy-to-hard. Not alphabetical. Not sorted by type of tune (reels, jigs, song tunes, marches). Grace-notes iffy in spots.

I was somewhat dissappointed when I first received this book because I was expecting many tunes that I had heard of, but after I had played several of them I quickly saw that this collection is a trove of wonderful celtic melodies that I will enjoy learning. Many of these tunes are written in the old style and are quite satisfying to play. Enjoy!
