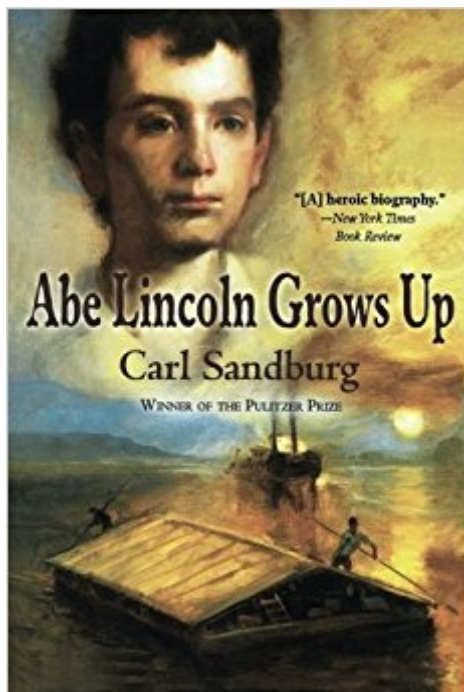

CARL SANDBURG (1878â “1967) was twice awarded the Pulitzer Prize, first in 1940 for his biography of Abraham Lincoln and again in 1951 for Complete Poems. Before becoming known as a poet, he worked as a milkman, an ice harvester, a dishwasher, a salesman, a fireman, and a journalist. Among his classics are the Rootabaga Stories, which he wrote for his young daughters at the beginning of his long and distinguished literary career.

This bio of Abe Lincoln is written in an unusual romanticized style. For me, the author's poetic roots come through too strongly. Also young Lincoln's "thoughts" frequently appear in the narrative, which I found disconcerting. They seemed more sophisticated than I believed plausible for his given age and life experience. Although the book makes a good read-aloud for ages 7-12, in many ways I think it is more readable for adults because it illuminates the world socio-political-cultural context of the time. For grade-schoolers, I would choose the Landmark and D'Aulaire books on Lincoln.
