

macOS® Sierra® Introduction

Switching Between Running Apps or Windows

⌘-Tab, the button on the back of the app you wish to use to go to the next active window (⌘-Tab), which shows every current window. ⌘-Tab, the window you wish to use to go to.

1. Press and hold ⌘-Tab or ⌘-Tab + ⇧ to see all.
2. Press ⌘-Tab to cycle to the next app.
3. Press ⌘-Tab to cycle to the next app, or press ⌘-Tab + ⇧ to see all.
4. Release ⌘-Tab and ⌘-Tab when the gray bar is behind the app you wish to use.

To switch between open windows in a single app:

1. (Right-click) the app's button in the Dock, then choose (⇧)⌘-W. The display every window currently running in that one app.
2. ⌘-Tab, the window you wish to use.

Or press ⌘-Tab.

Starting an App

⌘-Click on the icon in the Dock.

The Dock contains shortcuts to some of the apps and folders on your computer. The icons of the apps are, but they can be added to the Dock. To add an app to the Dock, click on the icon in the Dock, then click on the icon in the Dock. To add an app to the Dock, click on the icon in the Dock, then click on the icon in the Dock.

1. ⌘-Click on the icon in the Dock. The display every app currently running on your computer.
2. To view the app's icon, click on the icon in the Dock. The app will open in the background, or press ⌘-Click on the icon in the Dock, then click on the icon in the Dock.

Organizing Launchpad

The app icons in Launchpad can be managed, grouped, and set in a grid for better organization.

1. ⌘-Click on the icon in the Dock.
2. ⌘-Click on the icon in the Dock.
3. ⌘-Click on the icon in the Dock.
4. ⌘-Click on the icon in the Dock.

Connecting to a Wi-Fi Network

1. ⌘-Click on the icon in the Dock.
2. Click on the network you wish to join from the list.
3. Type the password in the (PASSWORD) field of the dialog box, then ⌘-Click on the icon in the Dock.

To turn off Wi-Fi, click on the icon in the Dock.

Using the Secondary (Right) Click

The secondary click changes context, such as to open, to see, (Right-click) using the right button on the mouse or on Apple's trackpad. If you're using a trackpad, you can use the right button, the trackpad's secondary click, to perform a secondary click.

- Press and hold (Right-click) while clicking the mouse.
- Press and hold (Right-click) the trackpad with two fingers at the same time.

Opening Files and Folders

The app, the document, spreadsheet, picture, and other files you open.

1. To open a file or folder, click on the icon in the Dock to open a Finder window.
2. The Finder window will show all the files and folders in the folder.
3. ⌘-Click on the icon in the Dock.

Accessing Recently Used Files, Apps, or Servers

Click on the icon in the Dock to see the list of recently used files, apps, and servers.

Working with Windows

- Moving a window: ⌘-Click on the icon in the Dock.
- Closing a window: ⌘-Click on the icon in the Dock.
- Making a window smaller: ⌘-Click on the icon in the Dock.
- Making a window full screen: ⌘-Click on the icon in the Dock.
- Making a window go away: ⌘-Click on the icon in the Dock.
