

This may very well be the deepest tarot deck out there, but it can be tough to read. If you're picking this deck up after having had experience reading RW based decks, my best advice is to dump RW out of your head. Thoth is basically it's own system, as the RW is a different system. There's very few facial features on the figures portrayed in the Thoth, so you're not going to be able to look at a figure and read their face for any clues. I really feel this deck reads the energy behind the person and not the person specifically. I use this deck to read myself; it has a way of cutting straight to the issue.

This is a great deck to work with the Astrological Correspondences in the Cards. It is accurate in that way. With this deck, your readings will become much more accurate. I am a spot on Reader, but since I've been using this Thoth Deck, and doing my Readings with the Thoth System (doctrine), my Readings are much more accurate than they ever were before.

i love these cards. i am fairly new to tarot and these cards really speak to me. the illustrations are

beautiful. the cards are not as thick as some i have, but that makes them easier to shuffle. not sure how long they will hold up or how they will wear, but i suspect no worse than any regular playing cards. i would like a better box for the actual cards and the book with the cards is not very helpful for interpreting. i have bought a couple of books specifically relating to this deck and hopefully that will help. many of the illustrations speak for themselves though, so don't always need the references. definitely one of my favorite decks!

Still a perfect deck. I have been using the Thoth deck since around 2001 and have been around them since 1995. The colors and quality on this deck match any I have seen and are perfectly accurate Qabalistic representations. No complaints high quality cards with perfect colors and images.

I bought this for a friend so I haven't used them, but I did open it up to check quality and I was impressed. The box slides off to reveal an inner box with space for the deck itself which has its own box (2 thumbs up for that) and also a little poster with a spread specific to the Thoth deck. The cards themselves are beautiful and have a sturdy cardstock. Seems like a great product for anyone interested in Tarot, Crowley, or just occultism generally.

Beautiful cards, a nice smaller size which fits my short hands well. Images are beautiful. Cardstock is decent. Complex and elaborate system that pulls no punches - would recommend!

This deck is by far not only my first incursion to Tarot but my favorite so far. The cards are so well thought out and their meanings are defined not only by their traditional divinatory meanings but also by the artwork. So far I have come to depend on others' interpretations of the cards but am developing the intuition to interpret or discern the meanings of the cards. The primary spreads I have used are the simple 3card-PPF spread and the Opening of the Key Spread (OOTK) which is by far the most detailed and hardcore spread one can undertake. It is one that is more sequential rather than positional (as found in Celtic and pyramid spreads). Most of the information I have attained by the OOTK is derived from Paul Hughes Barolow's websites (newtarot.com and supertarot.co.uk) and his book "Tarot and the Magus." These are some of the spreads I have sought to master, all in time I guess. But the deck is by far accurate, calming, and can be used for meditation (as with the Haindl). A matter to clarify is that I have noticed many people speak of an inherent negativity associated with this deck. To this I may add that a cleansing should be carried

out for any deck after its initial purchase. In addition, I feel it is a matter of will to overcome the eeriness present in the cards. Barlow has stated that each card represents some spiritual entity, Liber 231 for Major Arcana, Goetia for the Numbered cards, and Enochian spirits for the court cards. Perhaps one is thus attuned to one of these beings but for my experience I have not felt any presence when working and otherwise with the deck. I do hope that the reader would be more informed of these matters and that one should not be carried away by the designer's reputation or the cards themselves. My primary use is for meditation, as a means to commune deeper into one's self and understand the forces that we are constantly interacting with in the world. I could include a list of readings that I feel contribute greatly to this understanding, such as Barlow's books and some works of Crowley, but it would never suffice. I suggest, in short, the process philosophy of Whitehead, Jung's archetypes, the work of Lacan on the role of psychoanalysis (much can be read further in the cards with Lacan), Deleuze's rhyzomes, Merleu-Ponty's Phenomenology of Perception, Prigogine's End of Certainty, the Kabbalah of Isaac Luria, spirituality of Sri Aurobindo, and Jodowersky's Holy Mountain, as perverse it may be, it and on youtube his video on the Tarot elucidate the true meaning of the Tarot, which is not simply for fortune-telling, but a tool that is used for self-development and increasing spiritual intuition. As varied as these insights are, I feel they are constructive with one's sense of development. Nonetheless, these are the influences that have aided me. As Bruce Lee would say, "have no limitation as limitation, no way as way." The Tarot integrates well with my philosophy and spirituality, but as a word of warning, do not become ultimately dependent on it, such as throwing down for little matters. Rather, use it in moderation, such that every instance contributes to your self-realization.
