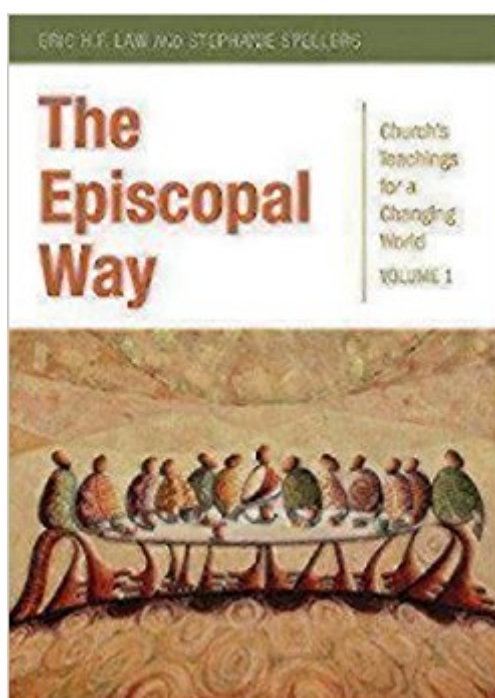

I rather liked her book and the fresh way that she and her co-author, Eric H.F. Law, talked about the Episcopal Church. This is a book for the 21st century. Those who grew up in the church 50 or more years ago might enjoy reading about a new way of understanding our faith and revealing it to those seeking. She folds in how digital communication, an understanding of how so many people find themselves multi-tasking, and a bottom up spirituality that can grab and like the hierarchy that is so implied in the 'Episcopal' name. She puts into exciting words that most of us who grew up in the Episcopal way saw as a well-watered way/garden that did not need much explaining.
